THE EVENT

VENUE OPENS: 06:00hrs on Saturday 10th February 2024. Camping is available on Friday and

Saturday nights, Cost £5.00 per night

RIG INSPECTION: Saturday 10th February 2024 - From 07:00hrs near the start line

Sunday 11th February 2024 - From 07:00hrs near the start line

Entrants are only required to get their Rig/Scooter inspected once before their first run

MUSHER'S MEETING: 07:30hrs (subject to change depending on entry numbers and temperature)

START TIME: 08:00hrs (subject to change depending on entry numbers and temperature)

ELIGIBILITY OF DOGS & DRIVERS:

Any dog participating in a Long Distance Trek organised by the Alaskan Malamute Working Association must be a pure bred sled dog and be registered with the Kennel Club to that effect, or have a rescue number issued by the Official Breed Club for that breed (sled dog breeds only) or have an AMWA Working Number.

Siberian Huskies issued with a BSHRA or SHWA(UK) Welfare Number or SSDR Rescue Number will be able to participate. The driver/owner must be a current AMWA member to be eligible.

Non sled dogs owned by participants are eligible to walk the course with a handler but may not be in harness or attached in any way to a rig/sled/driver.

Dogs undertaking any Long Distance Trek must be **18 Months** of age on or by the date of the event. Those between the age of 18 and 24 months old and participating in their first trek will normally be restricted to 7.5 miles or the minimum distance offered dependant on the team size with a minimum of 5 hours rest between runs. Longer distances may be permitted at the organiser's discretion taking into account proven fitness.

JUNIORS:

Junior members may take part in a non-competitive Long Distance Trek (day time only) at the organisers' discretion. They must however be accompanied by a parent in an accompanying team (in which case they must stay together for the entire distance) or alongside walking/running/cycling. They will not be permitted to take part in a night run unless between the ages of 16-18. This would also be at the organisers' discretion.

CLASSES

There will be no individual classes at this event, although there is a choice of long distance or shorter courses. There will be various marshalled checkpoints to pass, and withdraw as necessary

Long Distance (16 - 25 miles) Minimum team size: 2 dogs*, maximum 8 dogs

Short Distance (8 - 12 miles) Minimum team size: 1 dog, maximum 8 dogs

^{*}team size will be at the discretion of the organisers

ITEMS ADVISED TO TAKE WITH YOU ON A TREK

There are a number of items that you are advised to take with you on the trek. However, this list is not exhaustive. Some items are shown as compulsory as these are seen as a safety requirement to help locate you should you get lost. Please use your common sense!

- Rig Bag/Backpack (Compulsory)
- Water for Musher and dog(s)
- Dog Bowl(s)
- Treat/snacks
- Mobile phone (With emergency contact numbers) (Compulsory)
- Puncture repair kit & tools/spare wheel
- Waterproofs or change of coat
- High energy snacks
- Spare lead
- Head torch/torch (Compulsory)
- Whistle
- Dog boots or spares
- Rear red light (advisory)

TRAIL DESCRIPTION

The course offers a choice of between 8 to 25 miles (dependent on final trail selection by the organizers), over varying terrain, mostly woodland trails/firebreaks, and some wide forest tracks. The trail is relatively level with one or two small hills. We hope to offer up to 4 distances dependent on available trails.

BOOTING

Booting should not be required but it is at the Musher's discretion

PROTECTIVE HELMET The wearing of a protective helmet is COMPULSORY

The following approved types of helmets are acceptable. They must be undamaged and have a serviceable chin strap.

- a. Cycle helmet
- b. BMX helmet
- c. Ski helmet

Helmets must be available for inspection by the scrutineer during the rig inspection

VEHICLE ACCESSNo vehicle access is available to the trails

PARKING Parking will be in the designated camping area near to the start line.

There will be plenty or room to stake dogs out.

LIGHTING EQUIPMENT No wet acid batteries may be carried.

Plastic lenses are recommended, but any glass must be taped or

preferably bagged.

Back-up lights must be carried i.e., a head torch. The lights must be

available for inspection

We strongly recommend the use of a rear red light as a safety

precaution so the musher is clearly visible. There are inexpensive and

readily available.

BACKPACKING

For a small fee of £5.00, Backpackers can use the marked trails on the Saturday only

BACKPACKERS

Saturday 10th February 2024 at 0800hrs

MEETING

START TIME: Once the last Trek team has departed

THE COURSEBackpackers will have the option of selecting any of the marked trails

being used by the Trek participants. Normal coloured markers will be used. Each of the distances offered are eligible as a leg towards the AMWA Working Pack Dog – Working Title Scheme (for eligible dogs)

OTHER

VOLUNTEERS - Events cannot be run without assistance. Please volunteer. There is a space on the entry form to indicate your preference. We will be requiring marshals for checkpoints, snubbing to help start teams, and general assistance.

SELLING OF GOODS at the Event Site will not be permitted without prior approval of the Organisers.

WATER You need to provide your own water

CATERING The will be no catering available

CAMPING We have been granted permission by the Fonthill Estate to camp on site on the

Friday & Saturday nights at a cost of £5.00 per vehicle per night, providing that you

leave the site as you found it. You must take your rubbish home with you.

RUBBISH We have the use of this forest on the understanding that there is no trace of our

presence on the day after the Trek. This means that you must clear up your dogs

mess, fill in any holes and remove all litter.

Please do not secure your dogs stake out line to the trees. Thank you!


HOSPITAL

DIRECTIONS

The main entrance to Great Ridge is off the A303 near to the village of Chicklade, Wiltshire. Post Code **SP3 5SY**

Location of the entrance to Great Ridge – (What3words): dozed.crackled.really

From the West continue past the exit with the A350 (or join the A303 from the A350 if travelling from Warminster), go down the hill (Speed camera on R/H/S) and through the village of Chicklade. After national Speed Limit signs look for the 2nd turning on the L/H/S. There is a green sign with arrows for Bake Barn & Penning. There will also be an AMWA direction sign. Follow the track up past Bake Barn into the woods.
